WAKING SLEEPING BEAUTY PART 3

It seems like not much has happened since I wrote the last article. I did, however, manage to install rear brake calipers, do most of the prep work for painting under the hood and fabricate most of the various brackets, braces, and miscellaneous hardware needed to install the air conditioner. Most of this work is painfully slow, especially if you want to make it look as if it came from the factory. This is the kind of work that if I were paying someone, I would ask, "why is it taking so long and why does it cost so much."

The calipers were a simple bolt on operation, but the other tasks were more involved. For the paint work, I had to degrease everything under the hood, unbolt all the various items under the hood and move them out of the way to prepare for the paint work.

While I was working on these items, I was trying to decide what color to paint the car. After much discussion and soul searching we decided to go back with the original gray beige. While this is not necessarily my first color choice, it is much easier than trying to do a color change, without

completely disassembling the car. I will paint under the hood since I had to remove much of the under hood paraphernalia for the body work and the AC installation.

Painting under the hood of an automobile is difficult and time consuming, especially if the engine and front suspension is still in place. The engine bay must be degreased and everything that is bolted to the inner fender panels, firewall and radiator supports must be removed or at least moved aside to gain access to whatever is to be painted.

Next any rusty areas must be attacked. In my case there was some surface rust and some caulk that had aged and cracked. And as you might expect, the places that needed the most work were the hardest to reach. To prepare for caulking and painting, I removed any loose caulking and cleaned up any loose scale and rust. To do this I used a variety of low tech tools such as wire brushes, sandpaper, scrapers, a pocket knife and whatever else I thought would get the job done. This work is not necessarily fun but is absolutely critical to getting a good paint job. Paint just does not stick to dirt, oil, grease, or rust.

After cleaning the metal and removing as much rust as possible, I proceeded to clean and etch the metal with a phosphoric acid based solution. The etching solution cleans the metal and reacts with the metal to form a good base for primer/paint to adhere to. I then caulked all the seams, and primed any areas I had worked, using an etching primer. Some people say that if you use an etching solution, you do not need to use an etching primer, and vice versa. I don't know. I just feel better using both. After this, with the normal sanding, priming and taping, the area is ready for final paint.

In case you are interested, the etching primer is available at most paint stores. I prefer PPG, DuPont or Rustoleum. Usually the Rustoleum in a spray can will do everything I need to do. Of course if you want to paint the whole car, you would need to buy in larger quantities. The etching solution is a little more difficult to find. The automotive paint suppliers no longer stock this type metal prep/etching solution. They prefer to rely on the etching primer. I did however manage to find the etching solution at Lowes and at the Sherwin Williams paint store. Don't bother asking the clerks at Lowes to help in finding the etching solution. They do not know what it is. Just look in the paint primer section until you find it. Sherwin Williams does not stock the solution, but can order it in most any quantity you may want. This paint preparation is the hard part of the under hood paint work. The rest is much easier and much more fun.

I think I will leave any discussion of the AC installation for another time. I will need something for the next article.
