George has had a number of European cars, his most recent is a 1954 R-Type Bentley that he found in California a few years ago. After insuring that it was road-worthy he drove it back east putting 4600 miles on it in the process (must have made a few wrong turns). He regularly drives it to shows, around town, etc. Please welcome George when you get a chance.

Our program was Barney Gaylord and his son Elliott. Barney is the MG-A guru and he and his son have been travelling the country in a 1958 MG-A helping MG and other (primarily Brit car) owners with their cars. His present car is his third after losing his first two to wrecks (not his fault). This car pulls a small trailer with a bunch of tools and has nearly 500,000 miles on it. Barney visits car clubs learning of people who need help with their cars and repairing them or instructing them on how they can make many of the repairs themselves. In the last 2 years they have assisted with about 200 cars, approximately 10 appointments per week. One of the most unusual was a 1903 curve-dash Oldsmobile. Barney has a trip blog on his web site (no, I don't have it, that's what Google is for) where you can read of his adventures and see where he is headed. DAVID LEE DEAL



Our thoughts and prayers go out to the family of David Deal. He passed away June 9th after an extended illness.



David was one of the founders of the Table Rock Sports Car

Club and active with the first Rock Barn European Classic. He started the monthly fun rides for anyone who wanted to participate. Bruce Harless worked with David to have BREMC members meet up with the TRSCC in Morganton and then enjoy rides throughout the area. Below is David's obituary.

David Lee Deal, 66, of Morganton, NC passed away on Thursday, June 9, 2016. Born on March 3, 1950 in Danville, VA, he was the son of the late Charles and Sybil Dove Deal. David graduated from George Washington High School in 1968 and Averett College in 1972. He began his 40 year career in banking in 1972 with North Carolina National Bank and retired in 2013 from Community One Bank.

David was a member of First Baptist Church in Morganton through which he participated in ministry at the Burke Mission Station Soup Kitchen and Habitat for Humanity. He was a member and treasurer of Morganton Rotary Club and had previously served on the boards of the Historic Burke Foundation, United Way, Chamber of Commerce, and Burke United Christian Ministries.

In retirement, David developed a passion for classic sports cars and co-founded the Table Rock Sports Car Club. He enjoyed planning local car drives that highlighted the scenery of western NC, local eateries, and wineries. The car club also held fund drives to benefit the Joara foundation.

Mr. Deal is survived by his wife, Angela Deal of the home; a son, Aaron, a daughter, Melissa Cross and her husband, David; a granddaughter, Melrose; a brother, Bruce; a sister, Debra; and several nieces, nephews, and cousins.

A number of BREMC members attended the car show at Rock Barn Country Club and Spa last Saturday, in Conover, NC. This was a great show in a great location.

Judging for the show was by People's Choice. Each participant was given score cards and asked to judge each of the cars in the show. The cars were divided by the usual model and year designation. In addition, participants were also asked to judge by open and closed cars in each class. Sounds easy, doesn't it? A convertible or roadster is an open car and a sedan is a closed car. However, when you throw in things like removable hardtops and hard tops that disappear into the trunk, with the push of a button, the picture becomes murky.
